

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Advanced scientific research

From René Descartes to Blaise Pascal, and from Louis de Broglie to the recent French Nobel Prize winners in science like Alain Aspect, just to name a few, France benefits from a long-standing tradition of scientific research that underpins the nation's exceptional achievements in fields such as physics, chemistry, medicine, biotechnology, health and mathematics.

- France has a significant number of recipients for the Nobel Prize. The country has generated **sixty-five Nobel laureates**, on a level with the United States, the UK and Germany.
- France is strong in the field of mathematics with **thirteen winners of the**Fields Medal.
- France is the fourth in the world when it comes to the number of patent applications filed to the European Patent Office.

Diverse, high-quality programmes

There are more than 3500 public and private higher education institutions in France responding to the full spectrum of students' academic and professional aspirations: 72 universities, 220 schools of business and management, 227 engineering schools, 45 post-secondary public schools of art, 22 schools of architecture, as well as 3000 other specialised institutions that offer tertiary training in specific sectors such as allied health professions, social sciences, tourism, fashion, design, art and sports.

Long-standing intellectual tradition

Few countries in the world can take pride in their intellectual and artistic influence as France does. Apart from the above-mentioned research excellence, France also boasts a huge number of philosophers, scholars and painters that have influenced others in the world.

A Leader in Europe

France is undoubtedly a leader among European countries as it plays a pivotal role in world affairs. France is a permanent member of the United Nations Security Council.

As a founding Member State of the European Union, France has played since the 1950s a major role in the development of European institutions, policies and reforms. A course on Europe or an internship with a European firm is a great way to broaden your French experience and embrace Europe.

Thriving industries and tertiary sector

France is now ranked the world's seventh-largest economy, blending a rich historical legacy with modern innovation. France's economic landscape is characterised by a wide array of thriving industries and a robust tertiary sector. Examples include manufacturing, pharmaceutical production, aerospace, luxury goods, services – especially in tourism and finance and it is renowned for its wine and food industry.

In terms of industrial strengths, France is a manufacturing powerhouse with significant contributions from the car manufacturing and aerospace industries. Companies such as Peugeot, Renault and Airbus highlight France's capabilities in producing world-class cars and aircraft. Additionally, the country is also making significant strides in biotechnology, with investments aimed at developing innovative medical treatments and technologies.

As the world's most-visited country, **France attracts millions of tourists annually** thanks to its landmarks, cultural festivals and landscapes. The tourism sector is a vital component of the economy, generating substantial revenue and employment opportunities. Meanwhile, Paris, the capital city, is **a major financial hub in the world**, hosting numerous international banks, financial institutions and multinational companies in sectors like luxury goods, insurance and food products.



Discover Food, Culture and Landscapes

France is undoubtedly a hub of culture. Whether in Paris or beyond, France is characterised by its cultural heritage and dynamism. Fashion, cuisine, food, cinema, art and architecture, etc. Your academic journey in France will be accompanied by a dazzling cultural life.

With no less than 52 sites and monuments that are listed as UNESCO heritage sites, France's exceptional cultural monuments and natural landscapes attract about 100 million foreign tourists every year. In France, there is always something interesting for everyone! Thanks to an excellent transportation system, all these cultural sites are within reach in a few hours. In summer, you can also swim in three seas and three oceans with new friends and people.

Studying in France means having Europe on your doorstep! By train or plane, the major European capitals are all less than two hours from Paris. Bordered by nine countries, France is the ideal place from which to discover Europe. Visit them on weekends or during longer breaks in the academic calendar! You can even make these cities part of your curriculum with the Erasmus+ programme!



You do not have to speak French to study in France! But if you have been learning in English or Chinese for the most part of your studies and are now wondering "what language should I learn?" French is one of the best options a student can choose as the language is one of the most spoken languages, and the second-most learned language in the world, after English. Start learning the language now! Besides the academic benefits for university admission, immersing yourself in French offers a unique opportunity for personal and professional growth as well as cultural enrichment.



Build new connections

Studying abroad also means building new connections. Throughout your academic journey, you have countless opportunities to meet people from all walks of life and understand the way they live. Indeed, France hosts more than 430 000 international students every year. It will bring you new perspectives to how you see life in general.



COUNTLESS BENEFITS

To offer a great experience to international students, the French government and higher education institutions have implemented numerous measures.



Being an international student in France comes with many financial benefits. At most public universities, international students enjoy **reduced tuition fees**. Additionally, students can benefit from **various discounts on cultural activities**, such as free or reduced entry to museums, theatres and cinemas. Public transportation is affordable with student discounts. International students have access to **affordable meals** at university restaurants, where a complete meal costs 3,30 Euros (~30 HKD).

Financial aid for housing and social security for health further helps reduce living expenses. International students may even work or do a work placement during their study in France. Upon finishing their master's degree in France, students can get a visa to find a job, allowing them to get the most out of France, the country of ideas, innovation, history, and fashion.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Furthermore, the Consulate General of France in Hong Kong and Macau, as well as the French government, provide **generous grants and scholarships for students to pursue either their long-term or short-term goals in France** from linguistics scholarships, short-term science courses, culinary courses, Master's scholarships, PHD, research and more.



THE FRENCH HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM

The LMD System (Licence-Master-Doctorat)

The French higher education system follows the Bologna Process, which has successfully harmonised the credit transfer system across European countries.

Degrees awarded in the French higher education system are a reflection of a common European architecture known as the L-M-D system. LMD refers to the degree level and stands for "Licence-Master-Doctorate" – in other words, "Bachelor's-Master's-Doctorate" degrees. Each semester awards up to 30 ECTs (European Credit Transfer System) and can be transferred to other countries. Specifically, 1 ECTs credit is equivalent to about 25-30 hours of classes and students are supposed to accomplish 900 hours of coursework each semester.

Licence -Undergraduate degree

3 years, 180 ECTs

1 ECTs = 25-30 hrs. of coursework

Master -Master's degree

2 years, 120 ECTs

L+M = 300 ECTs & 5 years

D Doctorat -Phd degree

TYPES OF FRENCH HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION

The French higher education system is renowned for its flexible structure, offering diverse paths to allow students to pursue higher education. Here are the key components of the system:

Vocational education

Professionalized studies that last from 2 to 3 years after a baccalauréat (equivalent to HKDSE) and allow students to be ready to integrate the professional world. Students are usually specialised in practical and manual works, hospitality, technology, and will directly work at the end of the degree.

Universities

France has over 70 public universities, offering a wide range of programmes in all fields of study. These universities provide bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees and are known for their low tuition fees, as well as outstanding research and academic excellence.

Specialised Schools

These schools allow students to specialise themselves in defined areas such as business, art, veterinary, architecture and many other fields. Accessible from the first year of undergraduate studies, they are a good alternative for students who have a clear project in mind.

Grandes Écoles

As a particular type of French higher education institution, Grandes Écoles are often smaller and more specialised. These prestigious institutions focus on specific fields such as engineering, art, architecture, business, political science and public administration. Admission to these schools is highly competitive, usually through rigorous entrance examinations through these two paths: a) doing a traditional, two-year Classe préparatoire or b) direct entry after obtaining excellent examination results in the baccalauréat (equivalent to HKDSE). Nowadays, many Grandes Écoles offer admission to international students based on the excellence of their academic record.

ENROLL AND APPLY FOR A STUDENT VISA

Études en France (EEF) Platform





Since 1 October 2023, Hong Kong and Macau have been part of the Études en France platform. This is a unique online service for all the registration procedures in higher education in France and to apply for a visa for foreign students. There are two categories of application procedure on the EEF platform depending on your situation.

I AM APPLYING

Candidates can now use one single electronic system to apply to multiple degree programmes in France. First-year degree applicants must apply as a DAP candidate (Demande d'admission préalable) through Études en France. Second and third year of Bachelor Degree and Masters' degree applicants must also use the platform to apply. If the program is not available on the platform then students need to apply directly to the institution and then use the Pre-consular procedure to obtain the visa.

I AM ACCEPTED

All other students who have already secured their admission within a French university or school not available on the platform or who have been accepted into a study abroad program or a PhD program or who will take a short term course (over 90 days) need to complete a Pre-Consular application on the Études en France platform. The Pre-Consular application is very simple and is a mandatory step before students apply for a student visa.

ACADEMIC TRACK

France and its rich cultural heritage offer a wide range of art and humanities programs that allow students to develop their critical thinking, creativity, and openness to the world. Available from the first year of studies to doctoral level, these programmes can take place in high schools, universities, or specialized schools. Students immerse themselves in diverse subjects, from visual arts and design to philosophy and cultural studies, fostering a deep understanding of both historical and contemporary contexts.



In France, plenty of business and economics oriented schools offer high standard and qualitative education. Whether you wish to study finance, luxury, marketing or else, you will be able to become a specialist and gain a lot of experience. These programmes are offered at various levels, from vocational schools to universities and specialised institutions, making them accessible to a wide range of students. Many programmes are designed to cater to different academic backgrounds and often include preparatory courses to help students transition smoothly. During the last 3 years of study, students can usually specialised themselves in specific areas.

ACADEMIC TRACK

Students typically begin with a bachelor's degree in relevant disciplines such as sociology, political science, communication studies, or legal studies. Students engage in foundational courses covering theory, research methods, and critical thinking, along with specialised subjects tailored to their interests. In hospitality, students learn about management, customer service, and event planning, often through hands-on experiences in real-world settings. Many choose to further their education with a master's degree, allowing for specialisation in areas like public policy, international relations, or communication management, often culminating in a thesis or capstone project. For those pursuing academic or research careers, a PhD involves comprehensive study, original research, and the completion of a dissertation.





JOB OPPORTUNITIES

In law, professionals can work as lawyers, providing legal representation and advice, or as legal consultants, helping organisations navigate compliance issues. In politics, roles such as political analysts and campaign managers allow individuals to study trends and manage strategies that influence government decisions. The communication sector offers positions like public relations specialists, who manage an organisation's public image, and social media managers, who engage audiences online. These studies also provide access to positions within international organisations such European Union, UNESCO and the OECD, opening doors to global career opportunities.

ACADEMIC TRACK

For engineering or sciences, students begin with a strong foundation in mathematics and natural sciences. Then, students can pursue classes préparatoires aux Grandes Écoles (CPGE) for two years, preparing competitive entrance exams engineering schools. Alternatively, some Diplôme choose а Universitaire Technologie (DUT) or Bachelor Universitaire de Technologie (BUT), which offer a more hands-on education. Afterwards, students pursue a master's degree, where they can specialise and engage further in research projects or thesis work. Many specialise in renewable fields such as energy biotechnology at engineering schools or universities. In France, excellent Bachelor's degrees are available in fields like mechanical, civil, or electrical engineering.
